Curriculum Provision</p> <p>(Model Music Curriculum requirements: Singing, Listening, Composing and Performing.)</p>	<p>-As of September 2024, Key Stage 1 and 2 follow Kapow framework for Music. This programme covers Listening and Evaluating, Creating Sound, Notation, Improvising and Composing and Performing.</p> <p>- Years 1 - 4 have a timetabled lesson of music every week lasting at least 40 minutes</p> <p>-Key Stage 1 and 2 have weekly Singing Assemblies lasting 20 minutes</p> <p>-Songs are used throughout the curriculum, e.g. to learn times tables, phonics, continents, etc.</p> <p>-EYFS currently deliver their own music provision throughout the week</p>	<p>-Witness the impact of quality music teaching through the use of Kapow.</p> <p>-Improvement in children's musical vocabulary and understanding of the inter-related dimensions of music</p> <p>-Utilise CPD offered to non-music specialists through the Kapow website.</p> <p>-Introduce Kapow to EYFS.</p>	
<p>2. Whole class instrumental teaching</p>	<p>-Class ukulele lessons were given to Year 3 children through Severn Arts (until 2023).</p>	<p>-Whole class use of instruments will continue through Kapow.</p>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Class sets of recorders and glockenspiels available in school. Glockenspiels are used regularly in lessons across the school. - Recorder club has been offered to children in Key Stage 1. This was popular last year. - We have a small group set of keyboards, ukuleles and xylophones. Most untuned percussion instruments are well worn / damaged and in need of replacing. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Look into workshops and musical instrument opportunities to enhance music topics across year groups. - Begin replacing broken and worn instruments. - Continue to offer music clubs to children across the school. 	
<p>3. Access to lessons across a range of instruments and voice</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Brass lessons have been offered in the past. This was popular across Key Stage 2. Cost of instrument hire meant this could no longer continue. - Rocksteady provides lessons in vocal, bass guitar, guitar, keyboard, drum kit. - Other instrument exposure is limited to regular use of tuned and untuned percussion in classroom music lessons. - Weekly singing assemblies and Key Stage 2 choir (see below). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Continue with Rocksteady lessons. - Look into instrument workshops to enhance at least one topic per year group (e.g. Sitar in Year 3). - Look into affordable instrument lessons to be offered to each year group on a rolling timetable. 	

<p>4. Develop a school choir / vocal ensemble</p>	<p>- School choir is always popular and fills up fast for Key Stage 2. Rehearsals take place after school, once a week for 45 minutes</p>	<p>- Continue to offer performance opportunities for the school choir.</p>

Develop a school ensemble / band / group</p>	<p>- Rocksteady lessons are popular throughout Key Stage 1 and 2 providing the school with a number of bands. - Rocksteady concerts take place 3 times a year (termly).</p>	<p>- Continue with Rocksteady. - Look into providing a space in school for children to explore and play musical instruments</p>	
<p>6. Provide space for rehearsals and individual practice</p>	<p>- Library is currently used for Rocksteady lessons one afternoon a week</p>	<p>- Until another rehearsal space becomes available, continue to use library for Rocksteady lessons</p>	
<p>7. Develop a termly performance</p>	<p>- Christmas performances put on by EYFS (Nursery and Reception) - Year 1 perform a story to their parents in the Spring - Year 2 perform a Harvest production - Year 3 perform a Spring production - Year 4 put on an end of year production at the local high school for their parents.</p>	<p>- Continue with year group and Key Stage performances. - Hopefully, reintroduce dress rehearsals to the school.</p>

Provide opportunities to enjoy live performances at least once a year</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Rocksteady concerts take place once a term, The school and parents are able to enjoy 3 concerts a year. -Children enjoy a visit from the pantomime annually. -Choir are given numerous opportunities to perform to a range of audiences, including the school -When the choir perform at the theatre they are able to watch other schools perform on stage as well. -MFSA puts on an annual Matchborough's Got Talent. Winners and runners up perform to the school in a special assembly. 	<p>-Continue to give children opportunities to perform live and watch live performances.</p>
